

SGRC Quarantine Procedures

The Scarlet & Gold Riding Club (SGRC) has one designated quarantine area with two paddocks. The quarantine area is regulated by the Isolation/Observation requirements for new equine arrivals that are published by the base veterinarian. In accordance with these requirements and other club bylaw requirements, the below procedures will be followed when bringing new horses into the SGRC facility.

1. The Vice President will manage the quarantine facility with the help of the Executive Board. An Executive Board member must be present when a horse enters or leaves quarantine.
2. Anyone desiring to bring a new horse into the club facility or any horse that was boarded with the club and has been away for more than 90 days must be scheduled into quarantine.
3. All horses that are required to enter the facility through quarantine will be required to stay in quarantine for a minimum of 10 days. For no reason will a horse be allowed out of the quarantine area during this 10 day period.
4. All horses are required to arrive between the hours of 8 am and 8 pm. Should a horse arrive between 8 pm and 8 am, there will be a \$50 after hours charge. This charge will apply to all members bringing in horses after hours even if they are sharing transportation.
5. Scheduling will be on a first come first served basis so planning and communication on the part of the horse owner will be required. It may be necessary to hold off bringing in a new horse until a horse already in quarantine is removed or because there are other horses already scheduled for quarantine. It may be possible to coordinate more than one horse to arrive on the same day so that they will be able to share the quarantine area.
6. Should horses enter quarantine on different days; no horse can leave quarantine until the last horse that entered has completed the 10 day requirement.
7. All up-to-date shot records and coggins are required to be turned into the club 72 hours before the horse arrives. For no reason will a horse be allowed to enter the SGRC facility without the required vaccinations and coggins.
8. Only veterinarian services are allowed in quarantine. All other services must wait until the horse has been introduced into the regular horse population. The only exception to this is if a horse, while in quarantine, throws a shoe, a farrier may replace the shoe for the health of the horse.
9. All horses are required to be wormed with an approved wormer prior to leaving quarantine.
10. Quarantine must be cleaned and all horse manure removed on a daily basis. Upon leaving quarantine, in addition to the above, all water must be dumped and containers must be cleaned. Failure to comply will result in a \$35 per horse cleaning fee.
